RESEARCH

August - September 1988

Pathology research project with Dr GBM Lindop, Department of Pathology, Glasgow University, sponsored by the Scottish Home and Health Department. This was the first study to show the morphology of the mammalian peripolar cell. I became familiar with the use of both scanning and transmission electron microscopy techniques. The project was selected as Glasgow University's entry in the Cappell Award.

I am involved in an audit of all my personal surgical cases since starting work as a consultant and several other departmental audit projects including encouraging junior grade doctors to carry out supervised audit.

COMPUTER SKILLS

I am conversant with most aspects of computer and information technology. I set up and maintained the North of England Otolaryngological Society web site (www.NoEENT.co.uk) until 2007 and my research and audit projects are kept on computer databases. I have set up a web based departmental handbook for the Leeds General Infirmary ENT department and a website for General Practice ENT courses. I migrated the ENT UK newsletter to a fully web based publication, personally undertaking all aspects of this project from sourcing articles to editorials and from the web design to uploading of the whole publication.

MANAGEMENT

I have attended a management training course and have been involved in the co-ordination of medical student teaching and the Edinburgh College fellowship examinations. I sat on the specialist advisory board in Otolaryngology, The Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. I was, until recently a member of the specialist training committee of the Yorkshire Deanery for Otolaryngology. I was clinical director in ENT in The Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust from 2006 until 2009. I was appointed as a Trust Clinical Lead for Informatics in July 2007. I am a trust appraiser and undertake appraisal for my department and I am lead appraiser for the head and neck CSU. I managed the registrar placement in Leeds and authorized and policed leave arrangements for the registrar levels training grades.

I became deputy editor of the ENT-UK Newsletter in May 07 and editor in June 2008 I was appointed as editor. I carried out a significant part of editing this main source of medico-political information for ENT surgeons (junior and consultants) distributed to all members of our association. I transformed a drab and outdated newsletter into a modern and innovative publication. This required learning publication techniques and typesetting the entire production, transferring the final article to the publisher for printing only. I was a past council member of ENT UK.

I manage the acoustic neuroma service in Leeds, which has attracted more referrals year on year. I have started a system of virtual clinics. Patients with these benign brain tumours that have shown no growth of the tumour on an MR scan (and therefore the patient can be managed with a further scan and not surgery) can be spared a follow up appointment. I contact the patient by letter with this good news, arrange a further scan as needed and put the patient in touch with the clinical nurse specialist for advice if needed. This has reduced the wait for new patients to be seen.

MEDICO-LEGAL EXPERIENCE

I have extensive experience in medico-legal reports including major negligence cases. I have acted as an expert witness for the police and the coroner in cases of suspicious and unexplained deaths.
